

## DKC Students Need Support to Compete at Nationals

**Need & Opportunity** 

The *largest academic competition in the world* is coming to Overland Park, KS this summer and you can give local students from underprivileged schools the opportunity



to compete. The National Speech and Debate Association Tournament (NSDAT) will host nearly 4,000 students from across the country and around the world. While high school students must qualify to the tournament, the middle school division can be entered by any student that can find travel and pay the entry fees.

**DEBATE-Kansas City** (DKC) is an Urban Debate League with 573 active debaters from 29 member middle and high schools in the Greater Kansas City area. Our students have competed at the NSDAT but in very limited numbers due to travel costs. Since the tournament is being held locally travel and lodging costs are removed, which leaves only one barrier for DKC students: tournament entry fees.

DKC has over **50** students from twelve middle schools that have requested to compete at NSDAT. Each entry costs \$50. Most middle schools competing at the national tournament are from private or wealthy suburban schools with well-funded debate teams. However, our schools have depleted their limited debate budgets and the vast majority of our students are on free/reduced lunch, leaving their parents with little ability to help. Simply put without sponsorship DKC students will miss this unique opportunity to compete at a national speech and debate tournament.
